How do I know my youth is all spent? (Chorus) My get-up-and-go has got up and went! But, in spite of it all, I'm able to grin And think of the places my getup has been!

When I was young, my slippers were red; I could kick up my heels right over my head. When I was older my slippers were blue, But still I could dance the whole night through.

Now I am older, my slippers are black. I huff to the store and puff my way back. But never you laugh; I don't mind at all: I'd rather be huffing than not puff at all!

I get up each morning and dust off my wits, Open the paper, and read the Obits. If I'm not there, I know I'm not dead, So I eat a good breakfast and go back to bed!



Pete Seeger (1919 - 2014) was an American folk singer and social activist.

He had a string of hit records during the early 1950s including versions of "Goodnight Irene" and "We shall overcome". A prolific songwriter, his best -known songs include "Where Have All the Flowers Gone?", "If I Had a Hammer, "Kisses Sweeter Than Wine" and "Turn! Turn! Turn!", which have been recorded by many artists both in and outside the folk revival movement.

Excursions – we are looking for your opinions


